

I am looking forward to attending your sessions scheduled for the near future. I'm planning on attending the events in Concord (if I can afford the gas) and Plymouth. I provided the opportunity I would like to speak at any of these sessions since I am now ready to end my self imposed silence in my situation. I do not want to make it a "complaint session" (in the Navy we called it something else, but I won't use that kind of language), but would like to resent some facts that show the bias, disregard for the current laws and basic human rights, and abuse of power that is currently in place in the "Family Division". I am very close to reporting this to both the Attorney Generals office and the Judicial Conduct Committee and have vast amounts of evidence.

In answering some of your questions, my dealings have been with the Plymouth Family Court for the past two and a half years. When I could afford a lawyer I used one, but it was more the other way around, the lawyer used me and would only fight for my wallet and not my position. Now all my information comes from the state web site. I think the courts biggest challenge is from special interest groups, who I think make the judges paranoid to make a fair decision (see any "Domestic Violence" case) or influence them to legislate from the bench, ignoring laws that are currently in place and denying basic Constitutional rights.

I could go on more but I'll just close with this statement, how can you get a fair hearing when the judge says "Mr. Zwald, I don't care what you have to say".
