The New Hampshire Citizens Commission on the State Courts would like to ask you some questions about the state courts, including the Supreme Court, the Superior Court, the District Court and the Probate Court. We ask that you limit your responses to experiences with the state courts and not with state or local police or other law enforcement agencies.

1. What experience do you have with the state courts? I have had experiences with our family courts for four years to try to get more visitation with my daughter. Each time I requested more visitation I was denied.

2. Where do you get information about the state courts? I have not gotten information from the court system and have no idea how too.

3. How much do you know about how the state courts operate? I do not know how to how are state courts. I don't see any publications or in the local media.

4. Are you concerned about the expense of going to court? Expense is the least of my worries when it comes to seeing my daughter grow up this will only happen if Im given the opportunity to see my daughter more.
